Search our collection and the collections of many other libraries worldwide using WorldCat Local, which has an easy-to-use interface and is compatible for mobiles. It includes holdings in Novanet, the online catalogue of the 10 Nova Scotia universities and colleges in the Novanet consortium.

- Search many libraries at once for an item and then locate it in a library nearby. Find books and journals that you can pick up at your library.
- Find research articles and ebooks that can be directly viewed or downloaded.
- Quickly link to "Ask a Librarian" and other online services at your library.
- Create a personal profile that tells others about your interests. Build lists of library materials you can share with others. Post your review of an item, or contribute factual information about it such as historical context.

Older journals are available in print. Journals in print format are shelved in alphabetical order on the second floor. Some older volumes may have to be requested from storage, or acquired via our document delivery service.

The Kellogg Library offers specialized instructional programs for individuals as well as sessions tailored to specific groups or classes. The Kellogg supports information literacy across the health sciences curriculum including:

GET REMOTE ACCESS

REFERENCE & RESEARCH ASSISTANCE

The Kellogg Library offers professional reference assistance in researching basic and advanced health sciences questions. Walk in, phone or online help is available. Consultation appointments are available on request. Reference staff will also do mediated searches of health sciences bibliographic databases for a fee.

CIRCULATION (LOAN & RESERVE)

Check out and renew books, pay fines, place holds, and update borrower information (e.g. status, address, etc.) at Circulation. Reserve materials are all available from the Circulation desk. Photocopy and printing cards are issued here as well.

PHOTOCOPYING/COMPUTER PRINTING SERVICES

Photocopiers are located throughout the library. The charge for photocopying and printing is \$.12 per page for card users, coin operated machine charge \$.15 per page. Networked laser printing is available from most computers. A fee-based photocopying service is available to Dalhousie University faculty, staff, and students.

DOCUMENT DELIVERY

The Document Delivery service supports teaching, learning and research needs of Dalhousie students, staff and faculty by obtaining the loan of books and copies of articles and other research material not available from any Novanet member library. There is no charge to Dalhousie faculty, staff and students for this service and requests may be submitted using our online request form.
